Fort Loramie, Ohio is a community of 1,478 (Census 2010) located in Southwest Ohio (Shelby County). Surrounding cities include Sidney, 15 miles Southeast and Wapakoneta, 25 miles Northwest. Other major cities such as Dayton, Lima, Cincinnati, Columbus, Toledo, and Fort Wayne are all located with-in 50-100 miles of Fort Loramie.
