Under the instruction of Sarah Heilers, the Fort Loramie Agricultural Education classes are busy learning about many facets of agriculture.

Senior Capstone

With the end of school year quickly approaching, capstone projects are reaching completion. As students are finishing up their projects, they are also looking for underclassmen to take on the project next year. The goal is to continue the success started this year as well as expand on the ideas that were started.

Animal & Plant Bioscience

In a Plant Science unit, students have learned how plants can be classified and have been working on group presentations regarding the following plant functions: germination, photosynthesis, reproduction, respiration, and transpiration. Students have also been working in the greenhouse transplanting vegetable seedlings and trimming plants to prepare them for the upcoming greenhouse sale.

Plant & Horticulture Science

Students have learned about types of small engines used in the horticultural industry including 2 cycle, 4 cycle, gas, and diesel. They created presentations on the 4 strokes of a 4 cycle engine and learned the components of a small, air-cooled engine. Next they will learn to use specialty tools that will be required to disassemble and reassemble a small engine, such as valve spring compressors, torque wrenches, and piston ring compressors.
