Performance Index

The Performance Index measures the test results of every student, not just those who score proficient or higher. There are six levels on the index and schools receive points for every student in each of these levels. The higher the achievement level, the more the points awarded in the school's index. This rewards schools and districts for improving performance.

Hearing Screenings

Hearing screenings will be completed within the first few weeks of school for students in grades 1, 3, 5, 9, and 11 and all new students in the district. The hearing screening will consist of a screening of hearing acuity with an audiometer. If your child passes the hearing screening, you will not be contacted. If your child fails the screening, a rescreen and/or referral will be made. A hearing screen only provides a snapshot of how your child performs on the day the test was administered and is not a substitute for a complete hearing evaluation by an audiologist.
