Ways To Contribute:

- **Cash** - Gifts of cash or checks are easy and greatly appreciated.

What is the Fort Loramie Education Foundation?

The *Fort Loramie Education Foundation* is a broadly based, non-profit community organization whose purpose is exclusively educational and charitable. Its charge is to operate for the benefit of students, former students, and all persons seeking education whose parents have been or who presently are taxpayers in or residents of Fort Loramie School District.

The Foundation is governed and operated independently from the Board of Education under the direction of a seven-member board of directors. It has been formed with the ability to solicit and receive donations and charitable contributions; to receive and maintain real or personal property or both; and to use and apply the whole or any part of the foundation assets exclusively for educational and charitable purposes.

Scholarships are an important, but not an exclusive focus of the Foundation.
