What is College Credit Plus?

College Credit Plus is Ohio's dual credit program

- Students can earn high school and college credit at the same time
- Ohio residents in grades 7-12
- All public colleges and participating private colleges in Ohio
- Courses can be held at the high school, on a college campus or online

Student Participation in CCP

- 1. Students and parents must attend an informational meeting about CCP with the high school counselor
- 2. Students must show College Readiness:
 - Students should apply by March 1st to the college they intend to take courses through
 - Students must meet CCP eligibility guidelines
 - 3.0 GPA or
 - Remediation free scores on college placement exam, or
 - 2.75 GPA with A or B average in English and/or Math
 - Note: Program Eligibility is <u>not</u> the same thing as Course Eligibility
- 3. Once accepted, students must make an appointment with Mrs. Francis to go over course selection

College Eligible vs. College Ready...

- Considerations:
 - Social & emotional transitions with college expectations
 - Time management & organizational skills
- Mature Content Clause:
 - The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the CCP program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon CCP enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs.

CCP Course Selection

- Students may earn high school credits through any combination of college classes and classes taken at the high school
- Students may follow the listed pathways with the partner institution; or select other courses
 - To view the complete list of available CCP courses and pathways, you can view a college's course catalog online.
- Consider your own Personal Academic Goals
 - College Choice
 - Planned Major
 - Transferology.com

CCP Course Selection

- Students can earn up to 30 hours per year, but no more than 120 hours total while in the program.
- The 30 hour threshold includes both regular high school classes & college classes.
 - Regular high school credits are multiplied by 3 in the 30 hour calculation
- Example: If a student is taking 4 regular high school credit courses at Fort Loramie you would calculate as follows
 - 30 (# of High School credits x 3) = max # of eligible college semester hours a student may take that year
 - $30 (4 \times 3) = 18$ (student would be eligible to take up to 18 total semester hours of college credit that year)
- If a student exceeds 30 hours, the college will bill the student directly

Scheduling for CCP Courses

- Fort Loramie HS will require that students take at least 5 7 courses per semester to maintain eligibility for sports and also to maintain a full-time course schedule
- We currently have numerous CCP options built into our FLHS schedule for this year and we are working to get this accomplished for next year.

Scheduling for CCP Courses

Scheduling Conflicts:

- The Fort Loramie HS Schedule takes precedence over courses delivered at a college/university
- Students may not have room in their schedule to take all desired coursework
- College course may be full
- Mrs. Francis will work with students to appropriately fill their schedule but know that sometimes conflicts do arise and students must make a choice between courses

Scheduling for CCP Courses

UVCC Students:

- Potential UVCC students will work with Mrs. Francis to schedule course for the Fall of their Junior year. After that, they will work with their UVCC counselors to schedule coursework.
- Typical UVCC Juniors will take ENG121S Composition I, PLS121 American Government, & 1-2 CCP electives of their choice, as their UVCC schedule permits.

CCP Grades

- CCP courses will not count for the Honor Roll unless taken here with our teachers
- CCP courses will go on the student's High School and College Transcript and will count as part of the student's GPA for both institutions
 - The grade earned in the CCP course will be the grade earned at the high school
 - CCP courses and grades will follow student to college
- Please be aware that college courses at a college/university setting will be different than taking coursework at the High School
 - Pace of college course (much faster)
 - Accessibility of instructor (must visit during office hours... may be challenging)
 - Mature Subject Matter

CCP Academic Probation/Dismissal

- A student will be placed on CCP Academic Probation if:
 - They earn less than a cumulative 2.0 GPA in their CCP courses
 - They withdraw from 2 or more courses in one academic term
- While on CCP Academic Probation:
 - Students may only enroll in one CCP course for the following term
- Students who fail to increase their CCP GPA in that following term will be dismissed from the program.
- To be reinstated to the CCP program following Dismissal, students must submit a request for reinstatement and meet the reinstatement requirements.

Potential CCP Fees and Costs

- Students attending a Public College will not be required to pay for any books or fees
 - If a student <u>does not return their books</u> on time to the proper place or if the <u>book is damaged</u>, Fort Loramie Local Schools will seek reimbursement for each affected book
- If a student <u>fails a college course or withdraws</u> from the course past the withdraw date, Fort Loramie Local Schools will seek reimbursement for that course
- If a student <u>exceeds the amount of credits allowed</u> (30 per year; 120 per program), the college will bill the student directly

Next Steps

- 1. Talk with your parent about CCP (go over pros/cons of this program)
- 2. The Intent to Participate form must be given to Mrs.
 Francis by April 1, 2025 if you wish to participate in the CCP program for the 25-26 school year
- 3. Review and complete all admission requirements for any colleges/universities you may be interested in by March 1st
- 4. Once accepted, bring your acceptance paperwork and a list of potential courses to Mrs. Francis to discuss scheduling options for next year.

What is Advanced Placement?

- An upper level course where college credit can be earned through a culminating exam
 - Example: If you take an AP class you will take the AP exam at the end of the class. You will receive a 1,2,3,4, or 5 as your score. 5 is the highest.
 - The Ohio State University will give the following credit:
 - AP Physics 1
 - 3, 4, or 5 = 5 credit hours
 - AP Calculus A&B
 - 3, 4, 5= 5 credit hours

What is the difference between AP & CCP?

- AP is not a transcripted college credit; students must earn the score of 3 or better on their AP test to receive college credit at most universities/institutions of higher education
- AP is nationally tested
 - Students will learn the same material in all AP classrooms across the nation
 - CCP courses not evaluated in this format and not nationally tested

AP Deadlines & AP Agreement

- You will register for AP courses when you register for your other HS classes.
- You and your parents will sign the AP Student
 Contract.
 - Must submit this form to Mrs. Francis by April 25th.
 - This date is the <u>last day</u> to drop an AP course for the 25-26 school year.
