## ELEMENTARY DROP OFF IN THE A.M.

Parents, due to congestion that occurs at the intersection of Elm and Middle Streets in front of the elementary, we are asking that you or whoever is bringing your child to the drop-off at the elementary school please utilize the entire stretch of the side-walk along the driveway near the school doors. There is ample room for 6 or 7 vehicles to be dropping off at once if necessary. There is no need to wait until you are in the first spot for kids to get out of the vehicle.

This will hopefully keep the traffic through that area moving so that vehicles approaching the school do not have to stop on Elm St until there is room to pull into the school driveway, and also create a safer environment for the children who walk to school each day and need to cross at that intersection.

Therefore, we will provide Interim Reports and Grade Cards to parents/guardians who request them by contacting the principals office. ### ABSENCE NOTIFICATION POLICY



Parents are required by law to call the school or send a written note on the morning their child is absent or tardy with an explanation for such absence. This provides a check on the student's safety. The school's phone number for the Jr/Sr High School is 937-295-3342 and the Elementary phone number is 937-295-2931. Absent note forms are found on the Fort Loramie School website: [www.loramie.k12.oh.us](http://www.loramie.k12.oh.us) under "forms".

**EARLY DISMISSAL:** A written note, signed by a legal parent or guardian, is needed for each student who desires to leave school during the day or be dismissed early. You may use the absence note form as mentioned above. This note should include the students first and last names, elementary teacher name, date, parent's signature and reason for the early dismissal.

#### **INFO:**

- All students visiting a doctor or medical examiner during the school day **MUST** bring in a notice from the doctor's office accompanied by a signature of the parent/guardian.
- Students who reach the age of 18 will need to have written permission from their parents to write their own absence notes.
- Parents will be notified of any excessive absences per State Law. Excessive absences are 38 or more hours in one (1) month with or without excuse of 65 or more hours in one school year with or without excuse.

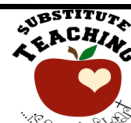

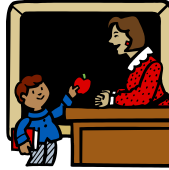

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## NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

The Elementary (K-6) and the Jr./Sr. High School buildings will be open each day until the beginning of school (August 15), 8:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. for new students to register.

Students new to our district should bring their birth certificate, health record of immunizations, Social Security number, and custody records, if applicable, with them.

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## CHECK BUS ROUTES AT OPEN HOUSE

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## ATHLETIC PHYSICALS/SPORTS CONTRACTS/ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

**Physical examinations and Training Contracts are required of all student athletes each year before the first practice or try out.** Physicals are required of all students in grades 7 through 12 – No exceptions. Athletic packets containing the physical evaluation forms and training contracts are available on Final Forms and at <https://www.ohsaa.org/medicine/physicalexamform>

**Academic Eligibility:** Student-athletes must currently be enrolled in school and have received a passing grade in a minimum of five one-credit courses, or the equivalent, in the immediately preceding grading period. Athletic eligibility will require a minimum grade point average of 1.0 each grading period. Students who fail to meet these criteria as well as other Ohio High School Athletic Association eligibility standards at the beginning of a grading period, will be ineligible for the following grading period.





## SCHOOL PICTURES

**Elementary School pictures will be taken on Thursday, September 26. Jr/Sr High School pictures will be taken on Friday, September 13.** The format will be similar to last year. This year we will again offer a wide variety of package choices and the option of different backgrounds.

We will continue the pre-pay program. Prior to pictures being taken, a flyer will be sent home describing the different packages. Parents and students pick out the package they want and send the appropriate payment to school with their student on picture day.

**In the event that you are not satisfied with the pictures, your child will be scheduled for retakes, or your money may be refunded in full.**
