Notes from the Jr./Sr. High School Principal

It has been a great first half to the school year here at Fort Loramie High School. We have a lot to proud of here, from our athletic accomplishments to our academic achievements.

On November 8th, we were awarded the National Blue Ribbon for Excellence by the U.S. Department of Education. This award was handed out to 356 schools across the nation this year. Of those 356, only 18% were high schools. Just in Ohio, only 14 schools were chosen for this honor, and only two high schools in the state were awarded. So, this is an incredible accomplishment for our students and staff.

On that same day, our Volleyball team won the OHSAA Division VII State Title. For the year, the team only had one loss (in the opening weekend, against eventual Div. VI Champion Coldwater in a 3-set match) and only went to a fourth set once the entire season, finishing with a 28-1 record. A truly remarkable, and record-setting, season.

Looking ahead for December, we will have our Sophomore students tour the Upper Valley Career Center early in the month, and on Dec. 16th, we will have our Winter Concert. Anyone who would like to attend, is welcome. Finally, our exam permission forms will soon be coming your way, if they haven't already depending on when this is published. We are asking parents to complete this form electronically. This process, and using Google Forms, has worked well for us the past few years. Please be on the lookout for an email with directions on how to complete this form and approve your child leaving school during their study hall when we have semester exams.

Thank you as always for the community's continued support. We enjoy a good amount of success each year, but that doesn't happen without you. It is your support that makes our success possible.

2023 - 2024 Fort Loramie Junior & Senior High School Accomplishments

The class of 2024 had a total of 65 students graduate. Of those graduates, 54% percent went to a 4-year university, 20% chose to attend a 2-year college, and 26% selected to enter the workforce or military service.

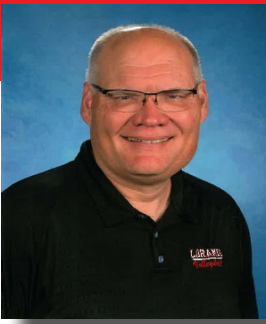

Fort Loramie Elementary has earned an outstanding 19th place ranking in the state with a Performance Index (PI) score of 111.74 on last spring's Ohio State Tests (OST). This exceptional achievement places us within the top 0.5% of all schools in Ohio! Across the district, we also excelled, tying for 6th place out of 865 districts with a PI score of 109.2, positioning us in the top 0.8% of all districts statewide. Congratulations to our students, staff, parents, and community—this milestone reflects a shared commitment to excellence and hard work, and it's truly something to celebrate!

A huge thank you goes to Spencer Knouff, Ty Kemper, and Ben Pleiman, who organized a Food Drive for St. Vincent De Paul as part of their Leadership Class Project. Their dedication and compassion led to the collection of an impressive 1,685 items, with all donations supporting our local food pantry. We are grateful for their leadership and the generosity of everyone who contributed—your kindness strengthens our community and makes a meaningful difference!

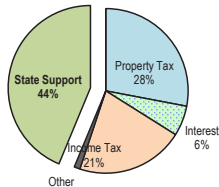

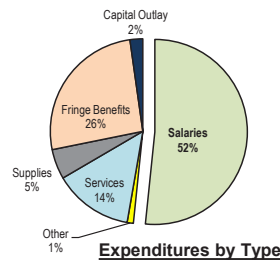

Total revenues increased 7.90% in FY 2024 compared to FY 2023. District income tax receipts decreased 11.44% and district property tax receipts increased by 15.14%. State support increased by 10.41%. Interest increased by 58.35%. State support was 43.74% of the total revenues.

Expenditures By Type

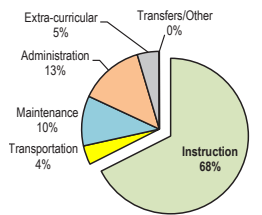

Total expenditures increased 6.95% in FY 2024 compared to FY 2023. Salaries and fringe benefit expenses increased 1.92% and 3.54% respectively. Service costs increased by 26.74% and supplies increased 46.85%. Capital outlay expense increased 5.29%.

In FY 2024, costs for instruction rose 4.26% and exceeded State receipts by \$2,164,772. Costs for Administration increased 10.55%. Maintenance costs increased by 26.26%. Transportation costs increased 6.21%. In total, revenues exceeded expenditures by \$928,462.
