Information regarding how to obtain registration and transportation for incoming kindergarteners for the 25-26 school year are in this newsletter.

Our Education Foundation participated in the Shelby County Match Day program. This year, we received \$19,713 from individual donations. We will utilize these funds to establish a Memorial Garden. The garden will be at the high school and will serve as a location to remember those students who passed prior to graduating from Fort Loramie schools. 2025 Kindergarten Registration & Screening

Screening will be held Thursday, March 27th in the high school gymnasium from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The registration materials and information needed to begin the process of kindergarten registration are on the school's website @ www.Loramie.k12.oh.us under the Student Registration tab. Please print and complete both the Fort Loramie Schools Student Registration form (front and back) and the 2025/2026 Kindergarten Bus Request Form. We highly recommend that you read the Kindergarten Screening and Registration Information and the Fort Loramie School District Bussing Procedures information prior to completing the requested forms to better understand the process. Along with the aforementioned forms, we will also need copies of the following documents: child's official birth certificate, social security card, immunization records, custody papers (if applicable) and, if renting, proof of residency. We will not schedule your child's screening time until all of the required paperwork has been completed and turned in to the elementary office. All documents are due by March 14th. Lastly, after your child has been screened, you will need to register your child through our Final Forms system. Final Forms registration must be completed by May 1st. Again, information regarding Final Forms registration and the link are on the school's website under the Student Registration tab. If at any point, you have questions or concerns, please feel free to contact the elementary office at (937) 295-2931. We look forward to meeting you and welcoming your child to the Fort Loramie Local School system.

Notes from the Jr./Sr. High School Principal

As the second semester at Fort Loramie High School has begun, and we continue to work to improve in our academic achievement, below are some dates that will be important for your child.

March 3rd, all seniors (FLHS & UVCC) will be at FLHS for CPR and AED training with Wilson Medical Center. This training will be paid for by the district, as it allows us to comply with state law, and is a requirement for graduation. More details will be sent to seniors and parents about this requirement and the schedule for this day.

March 11th will be our ACT testing for all juniors in the district at FLHS. All juniors who elected (it is a choice and not mandatory to take this year) to take the ACT will report and take this state-funded ACT at the high school.

March 28th, for students that are in grades 9-11, we will have our Career Day. On this day we will look for 30 professionals in and around the area to come in and speak with the students about their career, and educate the students on their profession.

April 4th – 6th will be our annual drama club production. This year’s show will be Mary Poppins and it will be done with students from Fort Loramie and Russia. This past fall, the production was held at Russia, so we will host this Spring. Overall, this partnership has worked out well for both schools.

Then beginning on April 9th, we will start state testing here at the school with the Language Arts exams. Our test dates this year will be a little different due to how our Easter break falls. Below is the schedule. On these dates, we will operate our bell clock on a two-hour delay schedule. Therefore, if your child does not test on that date, they will not need to report to school until 10am. If your child doesn’t test on a date, but still has to arrive at school as they normally do (before 8am), we will have rooms set aside for students who are not testing and they can complete work or activities at this time. Operating in this manner has worked well the past few years.

- April 9, April 10 – ELA Test (Grades 7, 8 & 10)
- April 24, April 25 – Biology (10th Grade) /US History (9th Grade) / 8th Science
- April 30, May 1 – Math Exams (Grades 7, 8, 9, & 10 – if taking Geometry)

Finally, I would just like to say thank you for everyone’s support this school year. From the staff, the students, the parents, and to the community – thank you for your support. It is everyone’s support that makes our success at FLHS possible.

Alumni Tournament

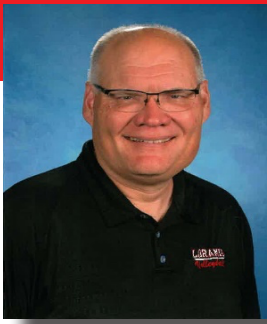
GYM Inc. will be sponsoring the Fort Loramie Volleyball and Basketball alumni tournaments.
