Community

Fort Loramie, Ohio a community of 1,497 is located in Southwest Ohio (Shelby County). Surrounding cities include Sidney Ohio, located approximately 15 miles Southeast, and other major cities such as Cincinnati, Columbus, Dayton, Lima, Toledo, and Fort Wayne, Indiana are all located within 50-100 miles of Fort Loramie.

Approximately 24.4% of Fort Loramie residents hold a Bachelors degree. In addition, 11.9% hold a Graduate or professional degree. The median household income is \$72,175. The unemployment rate is 3.7% and the median house or condo value is \$186,623 (City-Data.com).

Fort Loramie is within commuting distance of several institutions of higher learning including the following: Ohio State University-Lima, Rhodes State College, University of Northwestern Ohio, Wright State University-Lake Campus, Edison State Community College, Wright State University (Main Campus) and The University of Dayton.

District

Spanning 45 square miles, Fort Loramie School District serves the educational needs of Fort Loramie, Ohio. Currently, the district consists of one elementary school and one junior/senior high school utilizing a K-6 and 7-12 configuration.

Fort Loramie High School was recently recognized as a recipient of the College Success Award—Gold by GreatSchools.org for preparing students to succeed after graduation. In addition, the Fort Loramie Local Schools was rated in the top 100 schools in the State of Ohio by the U.S. News and World Report for the last three consecutive years. Most recently, Fort Loramie High School was also in consideration by the US Department of Education as a National Blue Ribbon School which will be officially announced later this school year. The Fort Loramie Elementary School was given this prestigious award in 2014.

High School

Fort Loramie High School is a comprehensive four year high school that offers a wide range of courses which are compatible to each student's interests, abilities, needs, and post high school plans. The fall enrollment for grades 9-12 in the 2024-2025 school year is 223. Fort Loramie High School will continue to operate on a modified block scheduling format. Students schedule their normal course load, along with a Tribe Time, which is used for extra help, homework, intervention, etc. The modified block schedule provides more instructional time for staff and students and incorporates an

Intervention and Enrichment period into the schedule to support and stretch the abilities of our students.
