## Elementary Drop Off In The A.M.

Parents, due to congestion that occurs at the intersection of Elm and Middle Streets in front of the elementary, we are asking that you or whoever is bringing your child to the drop-off at the elementary school, please utilize the entire stretch of the sidewalk along the driveway near the school doors. There is ample room for 6 or 7 vehicles to be dropping off at once if necessary. There is no need to wait until you are in the first spot for kids to get out of the vehicle. This will hopefully keep the traffic through that area moving so that vehicles approaching the school do not have to stop on Elm St. until there is room to pull into the school driveway, and also create a safer environment for the children who walk to school each day and need to cross at that intersection.

## Hearing Screenings

Hearing screenings will be administered in September and October to all new students and students in following grades: KG, 1, 3, 5, 9, and 11. Hearing screenings are important for speech, language development, reading, and learning. A hearing screening can detect if your child needs further hearing testing. Even if your child has passed a hearing screening previously, their hearing may have changed. The hearing screening will screen hearing acuity with an audiometer. If your child passes the hearing screening, you will not be contacted. If your child fails part of the screening, you will be contacted and a rescreen and/or referral will be made. A hearing screen only provides a snapshot of how your child performs on the day the test was administered and is not a substitute for a complete hearing evaluation by an audiologist.
