Performance Index

Fort Loramie Elementary has been ranked 19^{th} in the state with a Performance Index (PI) score of 111.74 on last spring's Ohio State Tests (OST). This achievement places us in the top 0.5% of all schools in Ohio! As a district, we tied for 6^{th} out of 865 districts with a PI score of 109.2, putting us in the top 0.8% of all districts across the state. Congratulations to our students, staff, parents, and community for their dedication and hard work. This is truly something to be proud of!

Much like our routine fire drills, the ALICE drill serves as a critical exercise to ensure that, in the unlikely event of an armed intruder, we are well-prepared to respond swiftly and effectively. In addition to this scheduled drill, please be aware that we will conduct at least two more unannounced drills throughout the school year as part of our ongoing efforts to maintain a secure and protected environment for everyone.
